Now thank we all our God, With heart and hands and voices, Who wondrous things hath done, In whom his world rejoices; Who from our mother's arms Hath blessed us on our way With countless gifts of love, And still is ours today.

From 1618 to 1648 Germany, and much of Europe, was devastated by famine and disease caused by the Thirty Years' War. Martin Rinkart, in 1636, a Lutheran pastor in Eilenburg, Germany, wrote this hymn "Now Thank We All Our God" (Nun danket alle Gott), a hymn of thanksgiving which is still being sung today.
