During Advent we are using a song written by Anne McKinstry for the response to the Candle Lighting. Anne is a long-time and deeply-beloved member of our congregation. She has a gift for hymn writing and one of her hymns is published in the New Century Hymnal ("With Joy Draw Water"). Anne has also written more than a dozen hymn books with a variety of approaches including pairing famous prayers with familiar tunes, writing service music, songs aimed at helping children learn to sing, hymns on justice and peace, setting Christ's words to tune, and incorporating the poetry of saints and the writings of Reinhold Niebuhr. She and her husband Rev. John McKinstry live in nearby Great Barrington.
