Moses Hogan (1957-2003) composed our anthem today. He is an American composer and arranger best known for his settings of spirituals. He enjoyed international renown as a conductor, pianist, and arranger. A number of his arrangements have become staples of our choral repertoire including the beautiful piece "Hear My Prayer" which the choir is singing today. Just one month shy of his 46th birthday, Moses Hogan died of a brain tumor.


