Psalm 85

# Music Notes ~ Peter Frost

John Carter, (Prelude and Postlude) renowned as a composer and pianist, was born in 1932 in Missouri, but raised in Florida. He quickly demonstrated extraordinary piano skills at a very young age. From 1949 to 1954 he attended the Oberlin Conservatory of Music. With just one semester remaining he joined the Army Special Services where he was assigned to the entertainment branch of the US military. Over the many years I have conducted church choirs, we have performed many wonderful compositions and arrangements by John Carter. After a glorious career as a pianist, composer, and arranger, he died from respiratory complications in Hempstead, New York, in 1981. He was just 49 years old.

## Hymn Notes ~ Liza Catino

"Be Thou My Vision" is considered the most famous Irish hymn. The text reflects early Christian life in Ireland c. 400-800 AD. The lyrics are in the form of an Iorica prayer - a prayer of protection. The lovely tune, Slane, is an Irish folk tune. Hymn tune names were commonly attributed to the place where folk song collectors discovered the music. Shláine is a very small Irish village with any historic sites from over 5,000 years ago. I have always been drawn to this beautiful melody and the poem has comforted me since I first learned it as a young child.
